


Values you can trust

In Sweden, people started joining the movement because they wanted Christianity to remain a subject in schools (and it is, along with other religions). We are proud of our history, which rests on two pillars: European anti-Nazism and the Swedish democratic movement. In recent vears, these values have been severely tested in Sweden and elsewhere in the world. The ISIS conflict in the Middle East. Putin's brutal attack on Ukraine. What distinguishes our values from others has perhaps not been clearer since the early days of the CDU in Germany, when the party started up in reaction to the unfathomable evil of WWII.
